Substances Included in the CoRAP

The Community Rolling Action Plan (CoRAP) was established by ECHA, the European Chemicals Agency, to manage the evaluation of substances according to Title VI Chapter 2 of REACH. Substances are prioritized for inclusion in this action plan on the basis of proposals from Member State authorities, reflecting a suspicion or concern about their risks (hazards, volume and/or exposure) with relevance for the health of citizens or protection of the environment in Europe.

Inclusion of a substance in the CoRAP **does not automatically imply any prohibition or restriction on its use**, but only that a targeted assessment is required in order to clarify its situation. Substance evaluation can result in a number of different outcomes, including the conclusion that risks are adequately controlled with the measures already in place.

The inclusion of a substance in the CoRAP **should therefore not be seen as a reason for alarm or immediate action**. EuPIA members actively monitor the evaluation of substances in the CoRAP and take prompt action in the event of any justified concern being raised about their use.
